Coming soon – School Zone

We are delighted to announce that we have been approved for the School Zone Traffic Calming initiative for outside our school. [Dublin City Council](#), in collaboration with the NTA and Green-Schools, are implementing this traffic calming initiative with us, and we aim to have outside the school vehicle free at drop off and pick up times. The front area of the school will be demarcated by specific colour circles on-road surface; plus a number of pencil shaped bollards to prevent illegal parking in vicinity of school and enabling us to use the lane beyond the bollards as a cycle lane.

The design features assist in creating a safer, calmer, more attractive environment at the school gate. We will need your continued cooperation also, please continue to park away from the school gate, and do not drive cars down the lane at drop off or pickup times.



Work is already happening on our 'School Zone', helping keep us all safer.
